## **ECF VISITOR RESPONSE PLAN**

Oneida Health Extended Care Facility (OH ECF) adheres to the CDC- Centers of Disease Control and New York State Department of Health Guidelines for Skilled Nursing Visitation and will adhere to the Core Principles of COVID-19 Infection Prevention.

Visitation will be allowed for all residents, at all times.

If any visitor fails to adhere to the Visitor Response Plan, he/she/they will be required to leave the premises and will be prohibited from in-person visits.

- 1. Spaces for visits (remain 6 feet apart)
  - a. Outdoor Patio (preferable)
  - b. Central Dining Room
  - c. Resident rooms when a resident's health status prevents the resident from leaving their room
  - d. Residents in private rooms

#### 2. Residents

- a. Highly encouraged to wear a face covering when visiting
- b. Encouraged to maintain social distancing
- c. Use Alcohol based hand sanitizer or wash hands before and after visit

#### 3. Visitors

- a. Remain 6 feet apart
- b. Visitors under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult 18 years of age or older
- c. Masking requirements will be posted at the entrance. Masking requirements are determined weekly by County Community Transmission rates and/or the facility outbreak status.
- d. Visitors must maintain social distancing.
- e. Visitors should also physically distance from other residents and staff in the facility
- f. Visitors should limit their movement in the facility and go directly to residents room or designated visitation area
- g. In room visitation may be discouraged or limited due to resident / roommate medical conditions

### 4. Hand washing

a. OH ECF will provide alcohol-based hand rub, consisting of at least 60 percent (60%) alcohol, to residents, visitors, and ombudsman visiting residents.

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- 5. Following visit, cleaning and disinfecting will be completed for visit area by a staff member. Resident and visitor will complete hand hygiene.
- 6. Long –Term Care Ombudsman may have immediate access to any resident. They must follow screening process, have no symptoms of COVID-19 and must adhere to the core principles of COVID-19 infection prevention. If they show signs and symptoms of COVID-19 other forms of technology will be offered to reach the patient such as a virtual visit or phone.
